 - ii. 19 Sports 18 of which are NCAA sanctioned (men's rowing the exception)
 - iii. Temple sports have not won enough very upsetting and needs to change
 - iv. Students are very successful in classroom with several teams exceeding previous results, and many individually on Dean's list;
 3.48 Combined GPA; 18 0f 19 teams earned a semester GPA of 3.0 or greater;
 95% Graduate Rate; Goldwater Scholar Diana Tiburcio, participated in "engineers without borders"

- v. Spent the first 120 days in the job listening about Temple with many different Stakeholders; had 96 individual meetings over the course of 7 months.
- vi. Have had many lunch meetings at Maxi's with donors to get them back on campus (not Liacouras Center meaning the east side of campus); very important and huge push for central part of campus
- vii. Has meeting tomorrow with Donors from class of 1971, will be their first time on campus since graduation
- viii. Strong encouragement of getting students involved in other areas of academics and campus life
- ix. Power Point presentation: Temple Athletics Vision: They have greatness in them; we are here to help them grow; want to talk about their personal and professional development; Highlights included:
- x. 7 values: Perseverance; Diversity; Community; Respect; Accountability; Integrity; Teamwork (for all student athletes)
 - i. Question: Conference Realignment are we in the right situation, conference, and division where we are?
 - ii. **Response:** Conference realignment is not new; it has been going on for some time (examples provided); feel we are in the best spot; Trying to be the best that we can be in our conference (American Athletic Conference); Have 8 new schools in our conference; Significant money coming into our conference; my job is to provide as much opportunity as possible in our current environment
 - iii. **Question:** What is our value add for Temple Athletics?
 - iv. Response: (referenced PowerPoint):41 different countries represented in Temple Athletics;52 percent female/48 males;169 new student athletes this fall
 - v. **Question:** Do we have many athletes in University Studies major?
 - vi. **Response:** Very good balance of Temple Student-Athlete College Distribution we do not have clustering of majors; offering short-duration Stud Abroad Opportunity and partnering with a college and faculty member; what they learn is invaluable
 - vii. Owl Affinity Groups; meet monthly and have a variety of different groups, organizations, and student driven initiatives; throughout the year each program will have a chance to highlight what they are doing

viii. Community Engagement with Athletics provide different games day opportunities: "Temple Experience"; "Temple Athletics MLK Day of Service" - partnered with 15 different nonprofits to do this over the course of 4 hours and helping in many ways (strong discussion and questions followed on this topic and opportunity)
